Marjolo, trading as Marjolo Partners Ltd., collects different amounts of information from you depending upon how you interact with us.

What Information Do We Collect About You?

When contacting us about a service offering, we will collect information such as name, email, company name, contact number, business address and website.

When subscribing to our mailing lists, we will collect information such as name and email address.

We may also collect information when you voluntarily complete client surveys or provide feedback to us.

Collecting this type of information helps us provide the most relevant content to you.

Cookies and Analytics

The Marjolo website uses cookies, including analytics, to help gather usage and performance information about our web pages, this helps us analyse the performance and website usage.

A cookie consists of information sent by a web server to a web browser, and stored by the browser. The information is then sent back to the server each time the browser requests a page from the server, this enables the web server to identify and track the web browser.

Marjolo may use both session and persistent cookies on the website. We will use the session cookies to keep track of you whilst you navigate the website. We will use the persistent cookies to enable our website to recognise you when you return.

Session cookies will be deleted from your computer when you close your browser. Persistent cookies will remain stored on your computer until deleted, or until they reach a specified expiry date.

Marjolo use Google Analytics to analyse the use of this website, Google Analytics generates statistical and other information about website use by means of cookies, which are stored on users' computers. The information generated relating to our website is used to create reports about the use of the website. Google will store this information; their privacy policy is available here.

Most browsers allow you to reject all cookies, whilst some browsers allow you to reject just third party cookies.
